INTRODUCTION

The Debate Club successfully organized an offline cultural talent showcase titled “Blitz Got Latent.”, which drew an audience of over 450.

Participants showcased their talents in singing, dancing, stand-up comedy, rap, poetry, and other creative performances, making the event lively and engaging.

EVENT HIGHLIGHTS

- The event had 27 participants, and drew an audience of 450+
- A wide variety of performances highlighted the creativity, confidence, and originality of the student community.
- The format required participants to predict their score prior to performing. Winners were determined based on accurate score prediction.
- The audience remained actively engaged, offering encouragement and appreciation to performers.
- The event concluded with 3 participants identified as winners.

PARTICIPATION RULES

- Each participant was allotted approximately 3 minutes to present their performance on stage.
- Prior to performing, participants were required to predict and write down the score they believed their performance would receive.
- Winners were determined based on accuracy, i.e., participants who correctly guessed their score beforehand were declared winners.

EVENT STRUCTURE

- The event was conducted in an offline, single-stage format.
- Participants performed in a pre-decided sequential order.
- Each participant was allotted approximately three minutes to present their performance.
- Prior to taking the stage, participants were required to predict and record the score they expected to receive for their performance.
- Performances were evaluated by a panel of judges.
