### Event Highlights

The event began with an introductory session where participants were briefed about the rules of procedure and assigned different **UNSC member states** to represent during the simulation.

The council session commenced with opening statements from delegates presenting their country's stance on the agenda: **"Deliberation on the Regulation of Artificial Intelligence in Military and Cyber Warfare."** Delegates discussed the growing role of artificial intelligence in global security and highlighted potential risks related to autonomous weapons systems, cyber warfare, and ethical concerns.

The debate progressed through moderated discussions and informal negotiations where participants collaborated, formed alliances, and proposed possible policy solutions. Delegates actively worked on drafting resolutions focusing on international regulations, responsible use of AI technologies, and mechanisms for global cooperation.

The session concluded with voting on the final resolution addressing the agenda. The event successfully simulated the diplomatic processes of the United Nations Security Council while encouraging critical thinking, negotiation, and policy-oriented debate among participants.
